Stubbs Wood

As outlined in the proposal documents and discussed at previous meetings of the Stubbs Wood Committee, the Committee will continue to consider the feedback received before presenting its recommendations to the Full Council at its meeting on 26 October 2026.

A further meeting of the Stubbs Wood Committee will take place in September/October to agree the recommendations that will be put before the Full Council. Should the Council decide that any changes are to be made to the governance or management of Stubbs Wood, there will be further consultation with residents before any decisions are implemented.

Proposed MUGA and Traffic, Parking and Village Enhancement Proposals

As the community event took place just before the summer holidays, when many residents are away, the Parish Council has decided that the formal public consultation on these proposals will take place during September. This will ensure that everyone has the opportunity to consider the proposals carefully and submit their views.

Further information on how to participate in the consultation will be included in the Summer Newsletter, which will be published in August, and will also be available on the Parish Council website and social media channels.

The Parish Council is grateful for the emails and comments already received. However, to ensure that all responses are considered fairly and consistently, residents are kindly asked to submit their views through the formal consultation process once it opens in September.
