Minutes of a meeting held at Ide Hill Village Hall
on Monday 24 June 2026 at 6.30 pm

1. To receive apologies and reasons for absence.

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr De Bono and Mr Dominic Rossi.

2. To receive declarations of personal, prejudicial and disclosable pecuniary interests on items on the agenda and updates to members' register of interests.

3. **A Public Open Session.** Members of the public will be welcome to address the Parish Council with any matters they have related to Stubbs Wood. Please note this item will be limited in time at the discretion of the Chairman.

- Dylan Bishop – Mr Bishop advised that he would like to approach the Council about coppicing some chestnut in Stubbs Wood and he would also like to fell the larch.

It was agreed that Cllr Manley, Jeff and Adam would meet Mr Bishop at Stubbs Wood and it was agreed that next steps can be agreed by email.

5. To agree the minutes of the meeting held on 1 June 2026 and matters arising not covered under Agenda Items.

6. Stubbs Wood Current Items

6.1 Countryside Stewardship Higher Tier (CSHT)/Rural Payments Agency (RPA)/Grants

On 19 June 2026 the Parish Council received an invitation to apply for a CSHT grants and Cllr Maybury has done an analysis of the grants. The papers are included at Appendix A. **In summary the Parish Council is in a good position and it was agreed that a working party should be set up to apply for grants to help identify and complete the application forms.**

6.2 Tree Survey

The Clerk advised that she has asked All Angles to attend the woods to identify the trees marked for the medium and low risk in the survey. There is one high risk tree that did not get felled but it needs to be done urgently and All Angles have been instructed to deal with the tree.

6.3 Insurance for Tractor

The Clerk updated the Committee on the insurance for the tractor and it was agreed that the Clerk and Cllr Manley would review the requirements of the DVLA.

6.4 Woodland Walk on 27 June 2026

Members resolved to agree to postpone the woodland walk due to the extreme heat to the Autumn.

7. Stubbs Wood Accounts

7.1 To note the audited accounts as at 31 March 2026

Members noted the accounts at Appendix B.

7.3 Memorial Bench

Members at the Parish Council meeting on 22 June 2026 agreed that the Committee should decide on whether a memorial bench could be placed in Stubbs Wood.

Members agreed that a memorial bench could be placed and the Clerk should inform the resident that the Parish Council will supply some more information about the type of bench and costings.

8. Friends of Stubbs Wood

8.1 To discuss and agree the governance of the Friends of Stubbs Wood with regard to the Parish Council

The Clerk explained the issues involving a relationship between the Friends of Stubbs Wood and the Parish Council.

Katie explained the pros and cons of establishing the Friends of Stubbs Wood as a group or a trust. The Friends of Stubbs Wood is not a charity.

Members resolved that the Friends of Stubbs Wood should be set up as an independent group to raise funds for Stubbs Wood. It was agreed that the status of the Group as a Charity/Trust could be addressed in the future if required.

8.2 To discuss future activities of the Friends.

It was agreed to that the activities of the Friends Group would be discussed by the Group when they met.

9. To discuss future initiatives and agree next steps, if appropriate, in preparation for the Community Consultation Meeting scheduled for 3 July.

Members agreed that following items should be presented:

- The option of raising the precept by £6,000 for Stubbs Wood to allow operating funds of £12,500 for the next year.
- Information on the Friends of Stubbs Wood
- Options of selling wood for wood products by felling
- Commercial Options for the Stubbs Wood

- > Just to summarise where I think we have got to with the Forestry Commission and Natural England
- >
- > RPA
- > We have just received on 19th June the formal invitation from the RPA to apply for Countryside Stewardship Higher Tier (CSHT) grants
- >
- > FC and Natural England
- > The Forestry Commission are in writing saying that the life of the WMP has been extended with their felling license which expires 2029 .Natural England have agreed in principle that their felling operations license will be extended to coincide with the licenses from the FC .In essence therefore we do not have to renew any felling licenses or the WMP until then .We can of course refresh the WMP and the licences if we are ready to do so before 2029 .
- > Natural England have clarified on the 12th June that their SSSI consent for forestry operations is valid until 2027 .If we make a CSHT application within that time frame then the NE consent will be valid for the life of the new RPA/CSHT agreement which will be for 5 years .
- > In short we have plenty of time to make our CSHT grant applications under the existing WMP and related felling licences .
- > I have asked the about a licence to fell larch in the compartment we identified during their visit .

- > We are in basic agreement with the FC based on the email from the FC dated 12th March 2026 that we can apply for the following grants-
- > CWD2,CPAC1 ,CPAC3,CPAC4,CPAC5,CPAC6
- > CSP12,CSP14
- > CWS7
- > Capital Items
- > AC2,FG12 ,FG13,FY6,SB6,SM11,TE11,TE17,VED1
- > All the relevant explanations for these codes are on the CSHT website .

- > This does NOT mean we cannot apply for other grants now or in the future BUT the strong recommendation from the FC is to keep it simple and apply for grants we can implement without additional resources and without incurring unnecessary additional delay .

- > Personally ,given the new committee and the appointment of a number of well qualified new members who are already known to the FC ,I feel that there is not much more I can add to the process .Progress may be better served if a working group is formed from the committee to complete the application process .I am of course very happy to continue to support the process in any way I can .I will defer to the Chair and the other members as to how best to move forward when we next meet

How to apply

When you are ready to apply, sign in to the [Rural Payments service](#) using your existing details, go to your 'Business overview' page and click on 'Apply for the Expanded SFI Offer or Countryside Stewardship Higher Tier'.

Your 'Agreement name' is the woodland property name used at the top of this email.

There are 3 steps to apply:

1. Select your CSHT actions and capital items
2. Request adviser review
3. Submit your application

You can find the requirements for each CSHT action in the [Find tool](#) and each capital item in [Capital grant finder](#). If you include additional actions or items, we may ask you to remove them and your application may be delayed.

You must send us any supporting documents, such as maps showing locations of actions or items, or quotes for actual cost items, when you have done this. This will avoid delays to your application.

You should reply to this email, attaching the documents, so we can process your application quickly.

What happens next

The Forestry Commission will review your application, and we will let you know when it is ready for you to submit. If there are differences from what was agreed, they will ask you to make further updates before they approve it. Once it has been approved, you can then submit it to the RPA via the [Rural Payments service](#).

After you've applied, we may ask you for further supporting documents, such as evidence of business viability. You can read about what is required in the [CSHT guidance](#).

If your application is successful, an agreement offer will be made available in the [Rural Payments service](#). You can accept or reject this offer. If you accept it, you will get a CSHT agreement, which will usually start on the first day of the following month. Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee that every application submitted will receive an offer, even if it is eligible.

The timeframe of the agreement will depend on the actions you've chosen. The first quarterly payment for land management actions will usually be made in the fourth month after the start date of your agreement. If you have SSSI land in your application, you will need to make sure SSSI consent is in place before we can pay you.

If you have capital items, you can claim for these in the [Rural Payments service](#) once you have completed the work. You can submit a capital claim at any time of year.
