Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs Miller and De Bono.

Domnic Rossi asked about the Stubbs Woods account and the Members and Clerk explained how the monies allocated from the Parish Council are used.

Tree Survey – Dominic Rossi asked if Cllr Evans could attend a working party meeting to help deal with the matters arising in the tree survey.

Members resolved to discuss Agenda Item 10.1 in confidence.

- **5.1 Highways** Cllr Fribbens advised that he had met with Highways along with a Member from the Sundridge ward. They discussed the 20mph scheme in Ide Hill and it would cost around £10,000. Provided the Parish Council with a speed toolkit along with some posters and stickers which are available to residents. The Parish Council had submitted a Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) however they require a new HIP to be submitted due to a change of structure in Highways.

Cllr Fribbens advised that the contract ended on 30 September 2024.

The Clerk advised that she has asked Aztech to clear up the car park prior to the cycle race on Sunday 13 October 2024.

The SWAG met to discuss the management which does not run out until 2027. They met with Tim Saunders of Silva Woodland Management. The SWAG looked at a possible new plan and compared it with the existing plan.

Cllr Manley commented on the suggested revised 5 year management plan. The plan needs to be revised to ensure the Parish Council still receive the RPA grant.

The plan will need to be reviewed by Tim Saunders and approved by the Full Council. The plan has be approved by the Forestry Commission and the CSA.

Members agreed that the management plan should be passed to Tim Saunders to review.

Members agreed that the Clerk should ask All Angles Tree Care to look at the urgent matter.

6.5 Stubbs Wood Volunteers

In preparation for the forthcoming Ide Hill Amenities Committee Meeting on Thursday 23rd January, the volunteers would like to request the PC to agree to fund the purchase of some training and equipment as set out below, all of which the volunteers believe is necessary to enable them to continue to carry out their work effectively in the woods.

As to the silky saws, the volunteers have been short of these for some time, and those they already have now need new blades. It is is not possible, so far as is known, to sharpen a silky blade. The loppers are needed to help control new sweet chestnut growth to keep the various views open.

As to the training, you will be aware that the volunteers are hoping to thin all of coupes 1a, 2a and 5a over the next 5 years. This, at 4.83 hectares by hand, is an ambitious target. Adding an additional chainsaw operator, (making three in all) would greatly increase (by 50%) the amount of work which the volunteers are able to carry out. Tony King, who lives in the village, would like to train up for this position. As you will recall, this means undertaking both the basic maintenance and cross-cutting course as well as the more advanced tree felling course, together enabling him to fell trees of up to 380 mm in diameter. Tony would, of course, need to provide and maintain his own chainsaw. A contribution of 50% of the cost of training has been made by the PC in previous cases, and the volunteers hope that this could be repeated on this occasion. Increasing the number of qualified chainsaw operators will greatly improve the chances of volunteers achieving their 5 year thinning target, thus relieving the PC of the cost of having such work carried out by contractors should the work fall behind target.

As to Martyn's email of 9th January reporting the difficulties which Tim Saunders is experiencing in dealing with the Parish Council's instructions, I have raised the matter with SWAG, and spoken with Caroline Lingham, who is currently out of the country on holiday. She is due back at the end of this week. She hopes to be able to come to the Amenities Committee and has some ideas which might be of interest. Also Stephen Palmer has suggested some ways of tackling the deer survey requirement and the lack of any real information about deer numbers.

If there is anything further to report before the meeting, I will let you know, but in the meanwhile, we would be grateful if you were able to consider the volunteers' requests for equipment and training as above and below - it would be great if this could be approved at the meeting (or at the full council meeting on 27th January) given that the bird nesting season will soon be upon us.

The costs referred to above are as follows:-

- 2 new silky saws currently £67.89 each. £135.78.
- 4 new silky saw blades currently £50.80 each. £203.20.
- 4 loppers currently £28.89 each or £34.99 when the current deal expires £115.56 or £139.96.

50% contribution to cost of chainsaw training - 50% of approx £1,000.00 (an exact quote is still awaited, but will follow when available) - approx £500.00.

Chainsaw chains - 2 chains per year @ £18.72 for 2 chainsaws would cost approximately £75.00 in total. If another chainsaw is brought into action, then the annual cost would rise to approximately £115.00. If Tony is trained, then 3 chains required now @ £20 each approx. £60.00

Total approx £1,038.94.

Prices approximate to allow for slight variations at point of purchase.

Subject: Access for building works

Good morning,

My name is Jeff Mashburn, and I live at 3 Camberwell Lane, Ide Hill. Some of the Councillors might remember me as I did some landscape gardening at the pre-school and worked with the Stubbs Wood volunteers in the past.

My wife and I are having a single-storey rear extension built at the back of our property, but as we are a mid-terrace house we have no direct access to our own back garden from the street (except through our neighbour's garden, though this is very restricted). Many of the materials will be taken through our house via the front door, but it would be incredibly helpful to have temporary access to the recreation ground to move a small mini-digger (1m width) from the track off Camberwell Lane to our garden. We will of course use track mats to protect the ground and, once the digger is in our garden, it will stay there until the works are completed.

Would it be possible to borrow a key for the gate to the recreation ground? We are hoping to begin the project on the 13th of January, though the date for bringing the mini-digger on site has not yet been decided.
